

PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGES

Below is a summary of Bylaws updates recommended by the PSBA Board of Directors. Language proposed for deletion appears in strikethrough font and language to be added appears in <u>underlined</u> font.

When Authority of Directors and Officers Begins – these updates are to make it clear that a Director's or Officer's authority to act begins upon election to the position.

- "5.3 Four (4) Directors shall be elected at the annual membership meeting from each of the above Districts and their authority to act shall begin immediately upon their election to office. A Director shall be deemed "from" a District in which he resides or in which his principal place of business is located. Director elected pursuant to this paragraph shall be known as "District Directors.""
- "5.4 In addition to the District Director, there shall be Directors elected on an At-Large basis, so as to ensure a balanced representation on the Board of all Association members. These Directors shall be known as "At-Large Directors" and their authority to act shall begin immediately upon their election to office."
 - "7.1 The executive officers of the Association shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. These Officers shall be natural persons, of full age, who, at the time of election, are also Directors of the Association. They shall be elected at the Annual Membership Meeting by the Regular Members in good standing and shall hold office for a term of two (2) years and their authority to act shall begin immediately upon their election to office."

Annual Audit Does Not Need to be "Certified" – Currently, PSBA's reconciled accounts are reviewed annually by an independent financial auditor who submits a "compiled" report to PSBA. The Board recommends that the additional cost to "certify" those findings according to "Generally Accepted Accounting Principles" (GAAP) need only be incurred if concerns are revealed. So, the Board recommends that the word "certified" be removed from the text of the audit requirement to make it clear that the certification requirement is optional, not mandatory.

"9.3 The books of account and financial records of the Association shall be subjected to a certified an audit each year by an independent Certified Public Accountant."

PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGES - CONTINUED

Removal of a Director for Missing Three Consecutive Meetings is Not "Mandatory and Automatic" – Currently, a Director who misses three consecutive meetings is automatically removed from his/her position, even if there are reasonable or unavoidable reasons for the absence. So, the Board recommends that the mandatory removal be changed to be removal by majority vote of the Board after the absent Director has had an opportunity to explain his/her absence.

"5.14 Any Director shall can be removed from the Board of Directors automatically for missing three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board of Directors by the majority vote of the voting members of the Board of Directors at any Board of Directors meeting, provided that the absent Director has been given the opportunity to provide the Board with the reasons for the Director's absence before the motion for removal is presented for a vote."

Suspension or Removal of a Member – Currently, there are no provisions in the Bylaws addressing enforcement of the PSBA Code of Ethics applicable to all Members. So, the Board recommends that the following additional language that provides for suspension or removal of members who do not support the goals, philosophies and programs of the PSBA.

- "3.14 Any Member can be suspended by a simple majority vote of the Executive Committee at any meeting of the Executive Committee for the Member's failure to support the goals, philosophies and programs of the Pennsylvania School Bus Association.
- <u>"3.15</u> Any Member's approval of membership status can be revoked by a simple majority vote of the Board of Directors due to the Member's failure to support the goals, philosophies and programs of the Pennsylvania School Bus Association, provided that the Member has been given the opportunity to address the Board before the motion for removal is presented for a confidential vote of the Board of Directors."

Transfer of Unexpired Annual Membership to Subsequent Owner - Currently, Membership in the Association is not transferable or assignable, even if a Member sells their business to a family member or long term employee in an asset transaction. So, the Board recommends the addition of language that permits transfer of Membership by majority vote of the Board.

"3.13 Membership in the Association is not transferable or assignable, except to a successor owner of a Member entity upon recommendation of the Executive Committee to the Board and a simple majority vote of the Board of Directors."


He Said What!?!... Understanding the Middle School Mind for a Smoother Ride Alex Smith Examples of ridiculous statements from middle school students.... "I just want to pass so I can keep my phone." "Adultery? Is that like a grown up tree? You know an ADULT-TREE." "Do we really have to move out of our parents' house someday?" Kid 1: Does it suck to have diabetes? Kid 2: Yeah, you have to check your blood all the time and you can't eat anything good. Kid 1: What about, like, donuts? Kid 2: Not 20: No! That's what got me here in the first place! 
The Middle School Mind

- Middle school corresponds with the beginning of adolescence
- Adolescence: transitional stage of physical and psychological development that occurs during the onset of puberty to early adulthood
 - Girls- average age of onset of puberty is 11
 - Boys- average age of onset of puberty is 12
- After infancy...the brain's most dramatic growth spurt occurs during adolescence

So what's developing?

- Grey matter or the "housing centers of the brain" is growing in size
- Meanwhile, white matter (i.e., roadways of the brain)that connects grey matter is building new connections and destroying old, inefficient ones.
- The frontal lobe is slowly starting to develop as well...





The frontal lobe, while developing, is still weak during early stages of adolescence and has trouble taking full control of the emotional part of brain.	
As a result	
 A middle schooler is gaining new thinking skillsbut can be easily influenced by intense, emotional states such as aggression, fear, lack of fear, or excitement. They are also more prone to do what's immediately satisfying instead of considering long-term consequences of their actionsthe "daredevil brain" example.

Fortunately, over the course of adolescence, the frontal cortex obtains more and more control over the limbic	
system.	
Other outcomes of developing frontal lobe in middle school students:	
As abstract thinking abilities develop in the frontal lobe, middle schoolers are more capable of seeing themselves in the eyes of others	
 This results in increased need of social acceptance, especially as rapid physical changes occurthey have a tendency of not wanting to stand out. This leads to increased susceptibility to peer pressure as well. 	
 Since the frontal lobe is not fully developed, they have a more difficult time evaluating the long-term consequences of their decisions, which may lead to more risk-taking behaviors, especially in groups. 	
 Since peer relationships are so important, correcting middle schoolers in front of peers often elicits feelings of HUMILIATION and SOCIAL EMBARRASMENT 	

Other outcomes of developing frontal lobe in	
middle school students:	
Rule testing and moral questioning is another result of improved independent decision making faculties.	
 Middle school students may no longer automatically follow rules set by authority figuresinstead they may question or deliberately disobey them. 	
Therefore, it is important to explain the reasoning behind set rules.	
What's with all the sleep?	
Biological sleep patterns shift toward later times for both sleeping and waking during adolescence meaning it is natural to not be able to fall asleep before 11:00 pm. • Does this natural pattern align with most middle school operating hours?	
Does this natural pattern align with most middle school operating hours? Teens need about 8 to 10 hours of sleep each night to function best. Most teens do not get enough sleep — one study found that only 15% reported sleeping 8 1/2 hours on school nights.

Instead, provide a cool down period so that their frontal lobes can be properly activated Summary A middle schooler's brain is competing against itself in an epic battle between the developing frontal lobe and the initially overactive emotional part of the brain. This may lead to erratic behavior, unforeseen emotional outbursts, and risk-taking behaviors, especially when in groups...do you ever drive a bus that seats 1 child? • Proactive and behavioral strategies that considers their brain functioning: • Establish a relationship with each student as early as possible Pinpoint students who are leaders and personally ask them to remind other students of safe behaviors (e.g., positive peer pressure) • Use consequence strategies that focus on behavior and utilize school personnel for individual plans for ongoing behaviors

Controlling the School Bus Environment

Inappropriate behavior on the school bus can be dangerous and has become more common in the news and internet media in recently. Managing how drivers and aids respond to incidents can be a challenge for contractors since parents and school administrators have different concerns and legal obligations than do the contractor.
